

HOW TO START HOMESCHOOLING

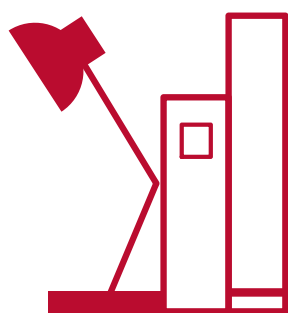


FIND YOUR HOMESCHOOL LAW

Your homeschool law will tell you what you need to do to notify your school board that you are homeschooling, what requirements you have (subjects, days, assessments), and what you need to send in for the end of the school year.

REACH OUT TO LOCAL HOMESCHOOLERS

Reading your homeschool laws can be confusing. Get a better understanding of what is required by talking to those currently homeschooling! These homeschoolers can help you understand the law and identify local resources you might not already be aware of.



IDENTIFY HOW YOU WANT TO HOMESCHOOL

Do you want to find your own pieces and make a custom curriculum, or do you need an all-in-one program? Do you want a secular curriculum, or are you looking for something with religion included? Do you want physical books or online? Make a list of your must-haves to help you with your search.

FIGURE OUT WHEN YOU CAN HOMESCHOOL

Look at your day and find where homeschooling fits for you. If you are working mornings, you can school in the evening or vice versa. Homeschooling is flexible, so pick with works for you and your children.



RESEARCH CURRICULUM

Ask in homeschool groups and search out reviews for curriculum that meet your homeschooling and schedule needs.
